Q. What is the Glan Llyn Working Group?

A. The new Glan Llyn Working Group has been set up to serve as the voice of the community, representing your views to St. Modwen.

Our group has been set up to give residents more involvement in the future of Glan Llyn. We're meeting regularly with St. Modwen to discuss ideas for the development – and would like to hear your views and opinions on this.

We'll also be keeping residents updated on how the development is progressing, including planning milestones and the creation of new homes and facilities.

Finally, we'll be updating you on fun events and activities happening in our community – look out for news from us!

Q. What do you have planned for the next year?

A. We had our first meeting last month, and are already thinking about what we'd like to achieve as your new working group.

We're working with St. Modwen to help plan upcoming community activities, including a gardening competition 'Glan Llyn in Bloom' and, later in the year, Glan Llyn's first Christmas event. If you have any ideas for community activities, we'd love to hear them.

OUR WORK WITH GWENT WILDLIFE TRUST



DID YOU KNOW...?

We've made huge biodiversity gains at Glan Llyn since we started work on site in 2010. Llanwern Steelworks was a brownfield site that required extensive remediation, and it has now been designated as a site of interest for nature conservation.

The historic watercourses (reens) were heavily polluted and are now able to support water voles. A strong population exists within the Ecology Park reen, with two smaller populations also on site.





DEVELOPMENT AND CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

We wanted to update you on some recent development milestones.

ONGOING CONSTRUCTION WORKS

The Avenue Road connection to Queensway in the east of the residential development site has gained planning consent and is now under construction. Main Street, which travels from the local centre area and phase 3a of St. Modwen Homes to the Avenue Road in the east, has also gained planning consent recently and is under construction. The central lake area earthworks have commenced.

NEW DEVELOPMENT PHASES

Persimmon Homes is developing the final properties in phase 1, as well as gearing up to start on phase 2d for an additional 178 properties.
