The composition of this design is fantastic and it's clear that a lot of thought went into it.


Thank you again to everyone who entered the competition, you produced some great work that we loved considering – picking a winner was guite a challenge!

Finally, another globe-centric design certainly went down well with the judges who were impressed with the artistic skills on show.




Glan Llyn's Central Lake is nearing completion and, alongside the East Lake, will form a centrepiece for the development.

As well as delivering vital habitats for wildlife, the lakes are also impressive feats of engineering, with every care

taken to ensure they are safe for the community to enjoy. This covers everything from the design of their banks to their integration with the other waterways on site.

To get a sense of the scale of the lakes, a visual comparison with Western Park is below.





The red dotted line you can see is the footpath boundary of the Western Park. The area within the footpath measures 7.2 acres – equivalent to nearly three international-sized rugby pitches. When measured together, the Central and East lakes are

equal to 8.4 acres, more than the size of the open green space at the Western Park.

We can't wait to see the community enjoying the beautiful landscapes being created here at Glan Llyn.

ST. MODWEN

Work to the temporary access road opposite the Western Pools is now complete, with the formation of a cul-de-sac along Bloomery Circle.

As the planting season has now started, we will be beginning landscaping to this area, including planting a range of native species. These will be chosen specifically to attract wildlife such as vital insects and pollinators, supporting the development's biodiversity.

Across the development, access through to the Queensway via phase 3A has now been opened by St. Modwen Homes.

We have recently marketed part of the local centre for sale, for a developer to deliver the retail uses and day nursery. We are now in advanced discussions with the successful bidder and will have some very exciting news to share shortly on this.

HOUSEBUILDERS

Work is nearly complete by Bellway Homes at Heron's Mead, where final homes are for sale. The last timber frame plot will be built in the sales car park, within a 2.4m hoarding to ensure the safety of surrounding residents.

Work is also continuing by Persimmon Homes at Springfield Meadows, Lovell at Locke Gardens, and by St. Modwen Homes, with more homes set to be delivered through the winter and spring.
